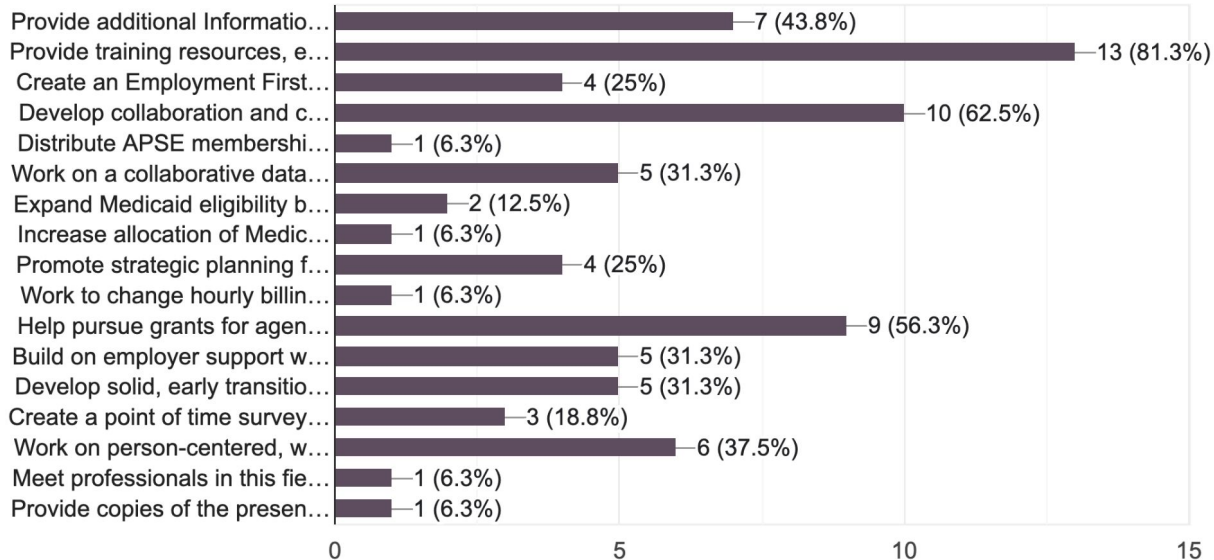

What would you prioritize as a follow-up to the summit? Select your top 5.

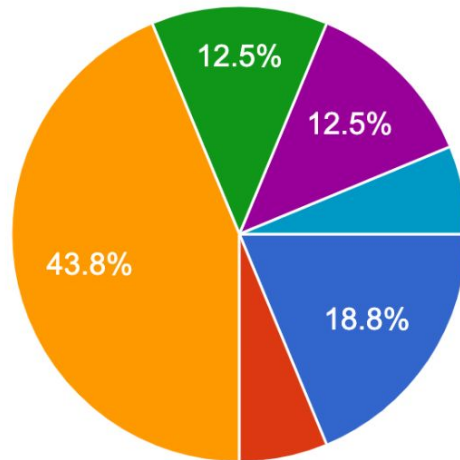

Do you have any suggestions for our APSE Chapter?

- More involvement of individuals receiving employment services.
- Allow interested persons to attend the APSE Board meetings i.e., strategic planning group
- At one point there was a call to bring all the players to the table: DOH, DOE, DVR, etc. which is nice, but from experience I can relate the situation where an individual was too old for DOE, too high functioning for DOH, too intractable for DVR. Took years to find appropriate services. So at some point all the planning, collaboration, etc. has to step aside for just getting things done, even if it's one individual at a time
- Continue to increase visibility in the community to build the Chapter. Engage membership by having them participate in active groups and activities - keep the interest level high.
- Diversify by reaching out to providers
- Maybe have more success stories locally for the individual who was helped with employment and how was their journey.
- As you create change toward EF practice, keep policies and procedures as flexible as possible. Avoid checking off boxes and seek creating what works for people.

Supervising and Implementing Employment Services

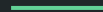
The first day workshop: Best Practice, focuses upon tools and efforts used by employment support professionals in managing day to day services
